Sermon Summary

This Easter Sunday we begin a 4-week sermon series that corresponds with our 2022 church theme: The God Of More. This idea is driven by the fact that our God is the God who is able to do exceedingly above all that we could ever dream or imagine! In this series we will explore the thing that unleashes God to do great things in our lives and in our church—our personal faith. We start off this Easter weekend by exploring what the Christian faith is all about and what it means for us as individuals to believe the truth of the gospel.

Who in your life is in need of prayer, physical help, or emotional encouragement right now?

Grow

Pastor Brett said this week that the resurrection of Jesus is the most powerful and impactful event in human history. Describe a way that Easter (Jesus rising from the tomb) has personally changed your life.

One of the main points of Sunday's sermon was that: Believing in Easter means our lives can have purpose. If you had to sum up your own life with a purpose or mission statement (in one sentence), what would it be?

According to Hebrews 11:1, What exactly is faith? How would you define it?

Go

How we respond to the true meaning and message of Easter makes all the difference in our eternal destiny. Do you know for certain where you will spend eternity? What are you basing that on?

Pastor Brett said that "Salvation isn't about what we know, it's about who we know." What does this statement mean to you?

Who in your life needs to be reminded that God created them with a purpose and for a purpose? Pray for them and ask God to give you opportunities to share the gospel with them.
